II. Accommodations

A wide range of accommodation options are available at varying price points. The College of Charleston maintains a list [here](#). Additionally, see below for options broken down by proximity to campus. Please note: this is not an exhaustive list. Many other options exist.

Closest to Campus

The Francis Marion Hotel:

0.2 miles from conference activities (4 minute walk | 2 minute drive)

Embassy Suites by Hilton Charleston Historic District:

0.4 miles from conference activities (8 minute walk | 3 minute drive)

Courtyard by Marriott Charleston Historic District:

0.4 miles from conference activities (8 minute walk | 3 minute drive)

Hampton Inn Charleston Historic District:

0.5 miles from conference activities (9 minute walk | 4 minute drive)

On-Campus Accommodation:

A select number of rooms will be available on campus! These will be private rooms within a 3 or 4-bedroom apartment suite. This option may be ideal for attendees who want to stay in the heart of downtown but are on a budget!

Room rate is *approximately* \$100/night. Parking is available on-campus with this reservation at \$10/day.




Night on the Town: The King Street Crawl!


